



Volunteer to be an Independent Custody Visitor

If your friend or relative was taken into police custody wouldn't you want to know that they were being treated with respect and dignity?

Independent Custody Visitors are local community members who check on the welfare of people in police custody, by visiting police stations unannounced. Representing various backgrounds and sections of the community, Independent Custody Visitors must be over 18 and have no direct involvement in the Criminal Justice System.

The role of the Independent Custody Visitor is purely voluntary but reimbursement for out of pocket expenses will be provided. We are currently looking for people from a variety of backgrounds to carry out the role in the Nottinghamshire area.

We welcome enquiries from everyone and value diversity in our volunteer workforce.

We are actively seeking to recruit people who are under-represented in our volunteer workforce, including people from black and minority ethnic communities, Lesbian Gay Bisexual and Transgendered people, young people and those with disabilities
