Section 22a for Derbyshire/Nottinghamshire Information Services collaboration

DECISION:

To progress the Derbyshire/Nottinghamshire Information Services (IS) collaboration the Commissioner is asked to sign off the section 22a agreement.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire Information Services collaboration started in May 2012. There is an overall programme of work being progressed to ensure that the collaborations aims are met. As part of this the merger of the senior management team has been proposed. To progress the collaboration and the creation of the management team a section 22a agreement needs to be in place. This highlights how both forces will operate during the collaboration.

1. How does the proposal address the Police and Crime Plan priorities?

The section 22a agreement enables the Commissioner to have a clear legal framework for the collaboration of IS between Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire.

2. What local needs are you expecting to meet?

The IS collaboration plans to add resilience for both Nottinghamshire (and Derbyshire), take a joint approach to achieving projects and improve the strategic innovation to enable technology in forces. The section 22a provides a governance framework for this to progress within.

- 3. What outcomes are expected to be achieved?

 To continue progress as planned in the IS collaboration business case.
- 4. What consultations have taken place with those affected by the proposal? What did they say?

A communications plan has been developed to communicate with staff, customers, supplier and unions.

Feedback from staff teams has been largely positive, but with obvious concerns about future change.

- 5. Have you considered all reasonable courses of action and options? The business case attached considered the options of how to merge the two IS teams. Nottinghamshire Police Chief Officer Team (COT) considered the report and agreed to the merger of the two teams.
- 6. What will be the impact be on performance and risk?

The section 22a is seen as an enabling step for the collaboration to support the Force managing performance and risk, it is not expected that there will be any negative effect on crime reduction.

7. What are the resource implications and will the proposal achieve greater efficiency and value for money?

Following the signing of the section 22a it is proposed to TUPE transfers members of the senior IS management team to Derbyshire Police Force. The overall business case aims to provide a more efficient and add value to IS service.
