TITLE: Community Safety Budget 2017-8

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The PCC is request to confirm his verbal agreed to use 2017-8 Community Safety Grant to:

- 1. Award up to £1,148,557 of Community Safety Grant to the Crime and Drugs Partnership (CDP), subject to a satisfactory delivery plan, to include the following areas of work:
 - Criminal justice substance misuse services: up to £296,513
 - Substance misuse service for young people: up to £28,284
 - Contribution towards the cost of Castle Gate House: £138,038
 - Discretionary spend to meet CDP strategic priorities: up to £685,722 to include initiatives to manage the risk from all forms of serious and organised crime, reduce knife crime in the city significantly, increase hate crime reporting in the city and reduce repeat victimisation and prevent extremism.
- 2. Award up to £675,118 of Community Safety Grant to the Safer Nottinghamshire Board (SNB), subject to a satisfactory delivery plan, to include the following areas of work:
 - Neighbourhood working: up to £270,750
 - IOM work: up to £95,000
 - Hate crime post: up to £45,125
 - Discretionary spend to include the domestic violence and hate crime steering groups: up to £264,243
- 3. Award £248,527 of Community Safety Grant in small grants to 23 third sector organisations through the 2017-8 Community Safety Fund to fund objectives:
 - Community led projects, working in partnership with Nottinghamshire Police, to facilitate positive relationships between BME and/or new and emerging communities and Nottinghamshire Police.
 - · Community led initiatives to promote community cohesion and tackle xenophobic and race-related hate crime.
 - Pilot or other projects to meet a gap in support services for victims
 - Community led initiatives to reduce noise and alcohol related anti-social behaviour.
 - Community led initiatives to reduce rural crime, including using social media to share local intelligence.
 - Targeted education and awareness raising initiatives with young people specifically in relation to new psychoactive substances and class A drugs.

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- Community led projects to support improved mental health with young people, and reduce drugs and alcohol use.
- Community led early intervention and prevention of drugs and alcohol related anti-social behaviour.
- Education and awareness raising initiatives to support the prevention of digital and cyber crime including fraud, computer misuse and on-line abuse.
- Community led initiatives in the city and conurbation to tackle knife crime. Initiatives must work closely with their local community safety partnership.
- Targeted early intervention and diversionary activity with people at risk of offending and/or anti-social behaviour.
- Projects working with offenders, particularly addressing the mental health needs of offenders.
- Develop and enable volunteering and active citizenship to build stronger communities.

INFORMATION IN SUPPORT OF DECISION: (e.g report or business case)

Each year, PCC has previously awarded community safety grants to the Crime and Drugs Partnership and the Safer Nottinghamshire Board to lead and deliver initiatives to achieve the strategic goals in the Nottinghamshire Police & Crime Plan. He has also supported the third sector to deliver initiatives through his Community Safety Fund.

Grant to the CDP and SNB (nos 1 and 2 above)

The CDP and SNB are key partners for the PCC. The grant will fund work to deliver the goals in the Police and Crime Plan. Improved monitoring and evaluation information will be provided for 2016-7.

Domestic and sexual abuse support services in the city from 2017-8 onwards will be funded through the partnership agreement between the City Council and the PCC.

Community Safety Fund (no 3 above)

The small grant recipients were selected through a robust assessment process in which all applications were assessed by two officers from NOPCC against a scored matrix. A draft funding list was submitted to an independent funding panel which included senior police officers, CDP, SNB as well as expert input from specialists (eg hate crime) where required. The panel agreed the final list of recommendations to the PCC. The PCC agreed that 23 projects would be funded to a total value of £248,527. This will include work to make savings to the costs of Castle Gate House in the city.
