### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The purpose of this decision is to formally approve the increase to the precept in 2023-24.

The Police and Crime Panel met on the 7 February 2023 to consider the proposed precept for 2023-24. A detailed summary of the Commissioner's proposed Precept and Council Tax Requirement for 2023-24 is set out in the Panel report pack attached, see agenda item 5.

The precept increase proposed of £14.94 for a band D property was supported by the Panel. A majority of members who were present at the meeting voted in favour of the proposed increase (10 members voting in support with 2 voting against).

### INFORMATION IN SUPPORT OF DECISION: (e.g., report or business case)

The government published its approach relating to Council Tax referendum principles for 2023-24 as part of its Spending Review in October 2021. In all three years 2022-23 to 2024-25 PCCs were to be allowed to increase band D bills by as much as £10. In the Provisional Grant Report in December 2022 this was increased from £10 to £15 for 2023-24.

#### Council Tax Proposal

The Commissioner's proposed Council Tax increase for 2023-24 is £14.94 for a Band D property. This is £269.19 for a Band D property. With this increase, Council Tax provides £4.9m more funding than in 2022-23 (excluding any increase in the tax base).

## Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Commissioner – Notice of Decision

The Police and Crime Commissioner's council tax is shown in the table below. This illustrates the impact of a £14.94, 5.9% increase. The additional cost to some 60% of Nottinghamshire council tax-payers would be 22 pence per week or less.
