<b>TITLE:</b>	Safer Streets 4 Community and Youth Intervention Projects April – September 2023
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### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Decision Record 2022.099 provided a high-level overview of the Safer Streets 4 funding allocations. Within the Decision Record it detailed the provision of £39,380 in 2023/24 to Nottingham City Council for the provision of Community and Youth Intervention projects in LSOA E01013851. This funding allocation has now been revised and reallocated as detailed below.

The PCC is therefore requested to approve the following funding allocations:

- Up to £8,500 to Communities Unite to deliver youth interventions within the Top Valley area
- Up to £8,000 to Helping Kids Achieve to deliver youth interventions within the Top Valley area
- Up to £22,880 to the City Council for premises hire, equipment, staffing costs etc associated with the Youth Interventions being delivered in Top Valley

The above funding will be spent between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 and 30th September 2023.

### INFORMATION IN SUPPORT OF DECISION: (eg report or business case)

The original Safer Streets 4 bid for the City included provision of up to £39,380 for Nottingham City Council to provide Community and Youth Intervention projects in LSOA E01013851 – this included the provision and staffing of suitable premises. Following two unsuccessful recruitment rounds the City council have been unable to secure appropriate staffing to undertake this work.

Alternative arrangements have therefore been considered with the City council providing access to a suitable premises for the Youth intervention and three local community organisations being approached to undertake interventions within the premises. This has resulted in the reallocation of the original £39,380 as detailed above. This reallocation of Safer Streets 4 funding has been approved by the Home Office.

Funding agreements will be put in place directly between the PCC and the two community providers and this is in line Standing Orders as each provider is receiving less than £10,000.

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### FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The Funding is all revenue funding and is from the Home Office Safer Streets 4 City budget. The funding will be spent and delivered this financial year (2023/24) and will be allocated as follows:

- Up to £8,500 to Communities Unite
- Up to £8,000 to Helping Kids Achieve
- Up to £22,880 to the City Council
