

The Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Commissioner's response to the publication of Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary's (HMICFRS) - Nottinghamshire Police – PEEL: Police effectiveness, efficiency and legitimacy 2018/19 (May 2019).

In 2018/19, HMICFRS adopted an integrated approach to its existing PEEL inspections. Integrated PEEL Assessment (IPA) combines into a single inspection the effectiveness, efficiency and legitimacy areas of PEEL. These areas had previously been inspected separately each year.

On 2nd May 2019, HMICFRS published its annual PEEL assessment of Nottinghamshire Police and judged that the Force:

- is 'Good' at effectively reducing crime and keeping people safe;
- 'Requires Improvement' at operating efficiently and providing sustainable services to the public; and
- is 'Good' in the way it treats the public and its workforce

I am pleased that Inspectors found that the Force was also 'Good' overall although there is clearly more work to be done to improve the management of demand and planning for the future.

Whilst I am very pleased with the overall judgement, nevertheless, I met with the Chief Constable to discuss this report, firstly to congratulate him on the good work being done and secondly to discuss the recommendations and concerns and sought assurances from him that action would be taken to address the issues requiring improvement.

The Force will continue to use its dedicated 4ACTION database for tracking and responding to all HMICFRS recommendations and areas for improvement overseen by the Deputy Chief Constable. The Force also provides regular HMICFRS update reports to my Joint Audit and Scrutiny Panel (JASP) who provide additional scrutiny in these important areas.
