#### About the survey

- The Police and Crime Survey is commissioned by the Nottinghamshire Police & Crime Commissioner and has been undertaken on a quarterly basis across the police force area since June 2017
- The survey robustly captures and tracks indicators of public trust and confidence in the police and resident's experience of crime and ASB and their satisfaction with any policing services received
- □ The survey uses an 'assisted self-completion' method, where teams of interviewers distribute questionnaires, offer support in completing them and return later to collect them if help is not required
- The survey achieves over 4,260 responses per year based on a sampling scheme representative of the local population at local authority level by age, gender, employment status and ethnicity
- Sampling points are set at Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) level to ensure good geographic coverage. Residents from all of Nottinghamshire's 697 LSOAs are surveyed over a two year period
- Quarterly waves of fieldwork help to minimise skews that can be caused by seasonality or significant events. The LSOAs in which fieldwork is undertaken each quarter are evenly distributed by deprivation and population profile
- In each wave, the survey provides a margin of error of +/-3% at the 95% confidence level across the force area. Responses are aggregated to report on the most recent 12 month rolling period each quarter.



#### Latest fieldwork and sample size

- The latest wave of fieldwork was undertaken between 14 May and 6 June 2022 under conditions compliant with the Market Research Society code of practice. In this wave, a total of 1,096 questionnaires were completed.
- One in eight LSOAs were selected from each of the following geographic areas:
  - Nottingham
  - South Nottinghamshire comprising Gedling, Broxtowe and Rushcliffe
  - Bassetlaw, Newark and Sherwood
  - Mansfield and Ashfield
- The survey achieved a sample of 4,324 respondents over the latest reporting period, broken down as follows:-



## Experience of Crime

### Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Survey 2022/23 Quarter 1


In the latest year, **31%** of respondents have been victim of a crime (a 1% pt decrease on the previous year but not significant). When online fraud and computer misuse offences are excluded, crime prevalence has seen no significant change in the last year (**17%**)

In the latest period, respondents from Nottingham remained most likely to have been victims of crime (34%), however South Nottinghamshire (+1% pts) and Mansfield and Ashfield (+1% pts) were the only areas that saw an increase..




When online fraud and computer misuse are excluded, respondents from Nottingham (21%) remain most likely to have been victims of crime. South Nottinghamshire, however, saw the most pronounced increase in experience of crime during the year (+2% pts).

Online fraud remains the most commonly experienced crime type across all Community Safety Partnership areas, and remains more prevalent in South Nottinghamshire (21%) and Nottingham (20%)






In the latest two years, 48% of crimes (excluding online and computer viruses or malware) went on to be reported to the police. This varies significantly by crime type, with 73% of burglary offences and only 1% of computer virus or malware offences being reported to police.



## Experience of Antisocial Behaviour

### Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Survey 2022/23 Quarter 1

64% of residents have personally experienced ASB in their neighbourhood in the last year, of which only 6% reported that the ASB had a major effect on their quality of life (8-10 on a 10 point scale). This has remained relatively stable over the last year.



'Noisy neighbours / loud parties' remain the most prevalent ASB issue experienced by respondents, however prevalence has reduced since 2021. There has been a 2% pt reduction in respondents reporting drug use and dealing in their area since 2021.

Drug use and dealing is the ASB issue occurring most frequently among those that experience it, with 68% saying it happens most weeks, followed by vehicle related nuisance (68%) The proportion stating people being intimidated or threatened occurs most weeks has increased over the last year (+7% pts).





Feelings of safety have generally stabilised over the last year, with the exception of feeling safe outside after dark – which has fallen by 5% pts since the year to June 2021 to 57%


Please say how safe or unsafe you generally feel in the following situations: % Feeling very or fairly safe – Excluding 'Don't Know'








## Trust and Confidence in the Police

All of indicators of public confidence in the police decreased in the year to June 2022 from the year to June 2021. 70% agree that the police in their local area treat people fairly and with respect and 55% report having confidence in their local police

Please say how much you agree or disagree with each of the following statements about the police in your local area: - Strongly Agree & Agree – Excluding 'Don't know'








## Public Contact and Satisfaction with the Police

### Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Survey 2022/23 Quarter 1

24% of respondents report having had contact Nottinghamshire Police over the last 12 months. Of those that have had contact, 60% reported feeling satisfied with the service they received whilst 21% reported being dissatisfied. This remained stable in the last year.



Of the 24% of respondents that reported having had contact with the police in the last 12 months, 57% had done so to report a crime or incident. This proportion has reduced from 65% in the year to June 2019






## Local Priorities for the Police and Partner Agencies


Reckless and dangerous driving and speeding remain the crime / community safety issues that respondents would most like to see tackled in their area. The proportion wanting to see more done to tackle speeding has fallen from 36% to 33% since the year to June 2021.

# Speeding (41%) and reckless and dangerous driving (41%) remain prominent concerns in Bassetlaw, Newark and Sherwood. Drug use and dealing (37%) remains a particularly significant community concern in Mansfield and Ashfield.
